

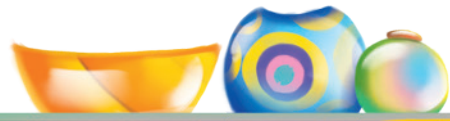

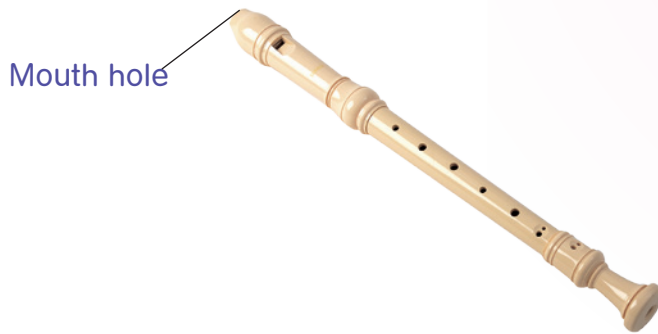

Woodwind instruments

Today we will talk about an instrument that you know quite well — the recorder.



When we play the recorder, we blow air through the mouth hole. The air turns into a wave. The vibration, or the wave, of air produces sound.

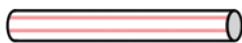
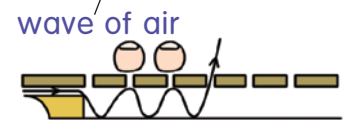
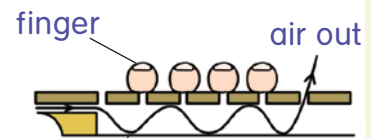
If we close more holes with our fingers, it takes the wave of air longer to leave the recorder.

Pitch → lower

If we close fewer holes, it takes the wave of air less time to leave the recorder.

Pitch → higher

This is similar to making music with straws.



If we blow air through a shorter straw, the sound will have a higher pitch.



If we blow air through a longer straw, the sound will have a lower pitch.

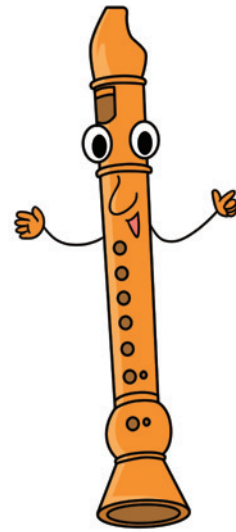

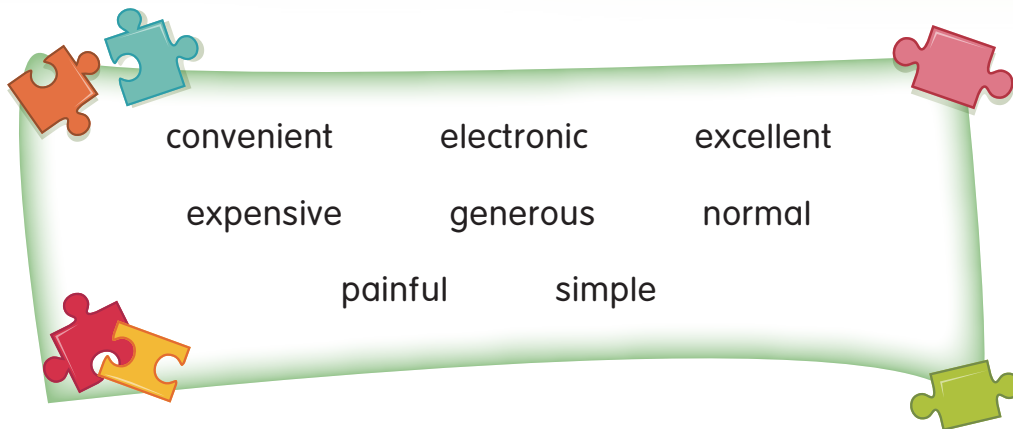

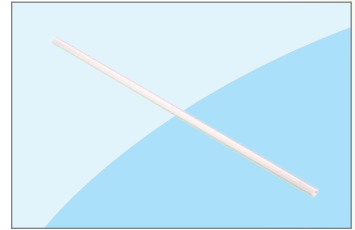
