## Review: Simple present tense vs present continuous tense

In Primary 2, we learned about two important tenses in English: the simple present tense and the present continuous tense. Let's review by reading the following conversation between Tom and Simon.

Tom: Hello Simon.
Simon: Hi Tom.
Tom: Do you want to come to my house to play?
Simon: Sorry, Tom. I am playing online now, and I am watching a video on my computer, too.
Tom: Oh. What about Friday?
Simon: Sorry. I play tennis every Friday.
Tom: What about Saturday?
Simon: I go to Chess Club on Saturday morning. Then I take the dog for a walk in the afternoon. What about Saturday evening?
Tom: Oh no. Sorry. I visit my grandparents every Saturday evening.
Simon: What about Sunday morning?
Tom: Yes, that's OK. How about ten o'clock?
Simon: That's fine. See you then!

## Unit 1

(1) Grammar explained (1): Instructions

We use verbs to give instructions. There is no subject pronoun (e.g. You) in instructions.

Close the door.


When we give sets of instructions, we join them together. We use ordinal numbers (first, second, third, etc.) or words like first, next, then and finally to talk about the order in which we do things.

## Making a cup of chocolate drink



First, boil water in a kettle.


Next, put chocolate powder in a cup.


Then, pour boiling water into the cup.


Finally, stir the chocolate drink and enjoy!
(1) Grammar explained (2): Object pronouns: it/them

We use pronouns to replace nouns in a sentence. When the noun is the subject of a sentence, we use subject pronouns. When the noun is the object of a sentence, the pronoun that replaces it is an object pronoun.
